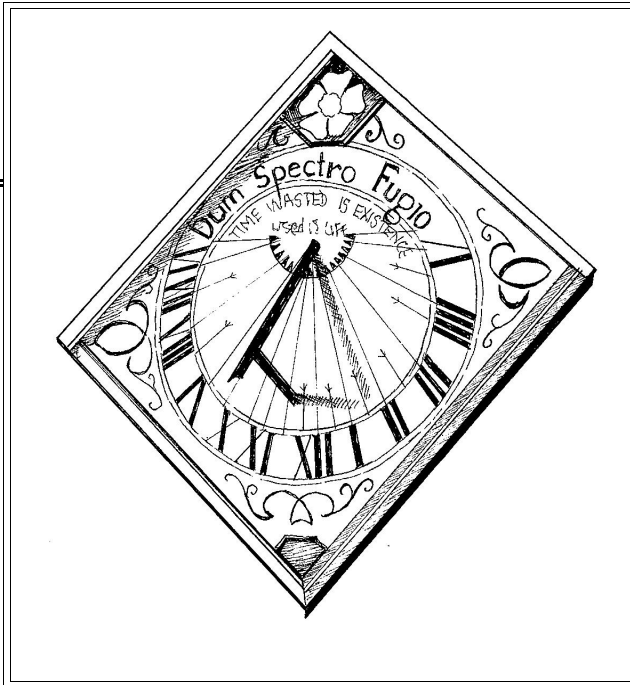

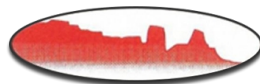

Y6 enjoyed a visit to York Minster last half term & were taken on a very informative guided tour of the Minster & Chapter House. In the afternoon they took part in activities relating to the Diocese of York, in the Learning Centre.. This half term got off to an action packed start with the Y6 residential visit to East Barnby Outdoor Education Centre. Despite cold conditions they thoroughly enjoyed the week, taking part in a range of outdoor activities & challenges . Year 6 children will soon take part in their 'Bikeability' sessions, a fun way to increase skills & develop cycling confidence. These sessions, delivered by skilled trainers, are very important in enabling our children to be able to cycle safely around the local area.

Year 3 and Year 4 are currently enjoying weekly swimming sessions at Stokesley swimming pool. The programme lasts for 10 weeks with swimming lessons delivered by trained instructors to teach the children different strokes including front crawl and back stroke. Kirkby & Gt. Broughton Nursery This term we are looking at Life Cycles.

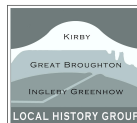

Back Lane Development - the appeal by the Developer against Hambleton's refusal to grant planning permission failed. The Planning Inspector upheld Hambleton's decision.

As many of you who are on Neil's patch will know he is retiring after 38 years on the 11th May. A sad occasion for us all as he has become so much part of our daily lives.

Fred Foster: An appreciation

For anyone of 'great age' to be born and die in the same house is rare indeed. But that distinction belongs to Mr Fred Foster. Born on January 17, 1922, in Woodbine Cottage, at the southern end of The Holme, he died there, aged 96, on February 6.

But though that lifelong link with his birthplace was not unbroken, it nevertheless was matched by exceptional dedication to his own village, which saw the St Hilda's Chapel at Teesside Crematorium filled with mourners for his funeral. As his eulogist said: "Fred made a difference.

His bond with Broughton and the parish came despite a career which, as a Customs and Excise officer, took him to many parts of Britain. But in 1951 he seized the opportunity of a posting to Teesside to return, with his wife Nora, to his birthplace cottage, which his mother, widowed just three weeks before Fred was born, had retained when she took the family to York when Fred was seven.

On his home patch Fred initiated and led a campaign which succeeded in replacing the grossly inadequate village school, which he had attended. He headed an ambitious 'Parish Paths' project by which local volunteers restored the entire local footpath network – an achievement held up as model for elsewhere. As parish council chairman he harnessed a community fund to plant trees along the Leven flood channel: though this lost out in a competition to a community bus service, it has proved more enduring.

Fred also chaired the sports club as it blossomed from its 'one field and a shed' state. Culminating in the opening of the new pavilion, this experience stood him in good stead when, as a district councillor, he oversaw the provision of leisure centres at Stokesley and Northallerton.

Back in Broughton, the village hall enhancement and extension were achieved under Fred's wing. He also conceived the idea of the small weirs on the beck, now fitted with fish ladders, that maintain flow in dry summers. All the while, he and Nora raised their family of three. Fred found time for bridge, chairing the Stokesley Bridge Club, and he put his carpentry skills to impressive use in making a number of exquisite miniature rooms, with furnishing and fittings inspired by those in his cottage.

Nora confesses to being "overwhelmed" by the kind reaction of villagers to Fred's passing. She and the family wish to thank the very many who have offered their sympathy and condolences. Nora quotes the inscription on St Paul's Cathedral to Sir Christopher Wren - "If you seek his monument, look around." The communities of our twin villages will surely agree this is not inappropriate for Mr Fred Foster.
